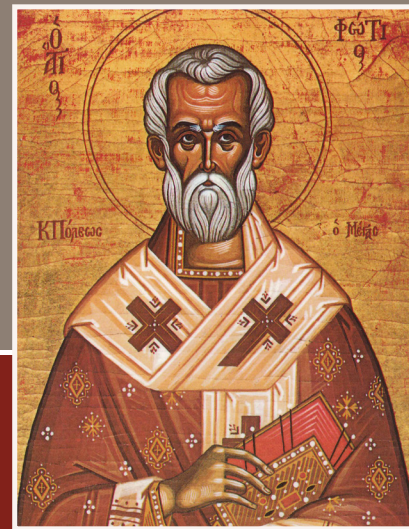

Candace Hetzner (PhD, University of Chicago) is associate dean for academic affairs at Boston College, where she also teaches political philosophy. She is the author of *The Unfinished Business of Thatcherism: The Values of the Enterprise Culture* (1999) and numerous articles in ethics and comparative politics. She has been a fellow of the Woodrow Wilson Foundation, Ford Foundation, National Institute of Mental Health, Center for European Studies at Harvard University, and the Earhart Foundation. She has served in administrative and faculty roles at the University of Massachusetts Boston and Fordham, Rutgers, and Lesley Universities. She has been president of the Northeast Association of Graduate Schools and chair of the Association of Graduate Schools in Catholic Colleges and Universities.
