

In addition to her role at HCHC, Helen serves on the Executive Committee of the Archdiocesan Council, is a member of Leadership 100, and has provided substantial support to the Metropolis of Atlanta's Diakonia Retreat Center and the St. Photios National Shrine. She was awarded the Medal of Saint Paul, the highest honor of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese, in recognition of her faithful service and generosity.

Helen credits her late parents, Andrew and Eula Carlos, for instilling in her a lifelong commitment to the Church and philanthropic service. With tears in my eyes, I thanked and hugged her. We made sure that she had a seat at our dinner. The verses from Luke 21:1-4 came to mind. What an example of sacrificial giving this sweet woman was!

Honorary Doctor of Divinity

REV. FR. ALEXANDER KARLOUTSOS,
Protopresbyter of the Ecumenical Throne

To characterize the fifty-four-year ministry of Fr. Alexander Karloutsos as "remarkable" is a great understatement. To begin simply (but most importantly to he and Presbytera Xanthi), Fr. Alexander is the father of three children and grandfather to nine. While at HCHC, he earned a Bachelors of Divinity in 1969 and, subsequently, a Master of Divinity in 1973. Today, he is the pastor of the Dormition of the Virgin Mary Church in the Hamptons, NY and Fr. Alexander serves as the Orthodox Christian Chaplain for the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey. He recently retired as the Vicar General of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America and Special Assistant to His Eminence Archbishop Elpidophoros.

He is the Spiritual Advisor to the Order of Saint Andrew, Archons of the Ecumenical Patriarchate in America, and to *Faith: An Endowment for Orthodoxy & Hellenism*. He also served for 46 years as the representative of the Archdiocese to the White House, the Congress, state and local officials, Greek American organizations, political action, religious freedom and human rights groups.

He was previously Executive Director of Leadership 100, serving from 1986 to 1992 and 1999 to 2004, and was appointed by Archbishop Iakovos as the first Vicar of Public

Affairs of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America in 1985, holding that position simultaneously until 1992 when he was appointed Special Assistant to His All-Holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew at the Ecumenical Patriarchate of Constantinople. In 1994, The Ecumenical Patriarch personally elevated Fr. Karloutsos to the prestigious office of Protopresbyter of the Sacred See of Saint Andrew.

Fr. Alexander has been blessed to serve in leadership/fundraising capacities for three unique church building programs: The Saint Nicholas National Shrine at Ground Zero; The Dormition of the Virgin Mary Church in Southampton, NY; and the Interdenominational Chapel at Camp David, Maryland, the country retreat of Presidents. Fr. Karloutsos also served as the principal fundraiser for the restoration of the Holy Sepulcher of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, in the Holy City of Jerusalem.

Fr. Karloutsos and his Presbytera Xanthi have been honored in the recent past for their fifty-four years ministry to the Archdiocese, the Ecumenical Patriarchate, the Hellenic Republic and the United States of America. In 2018, the Order of Saint Andrew the Apostle, Archons of the Ecumenical Patriarchate, bestowed upon Presbytera Karavellas-Karloutsos and Fr Alex, the most prestigious Patriarch Athenagoras Human Rights Award. Fr Alex was extremely humbled in 2022, to receive the Apostolic Cross of Saint Mark the Evangelist from His Beatitude Patriarch Theodore II of Alexandria; the Gold Cross of the Phoenix from Prime Minister of Greece; and the Presidential Medal of Freedom on July 7, 2022, from Joe Biden, President of the United States.
